

Detachment Boundaries





- The APP is used at the detachment level to assist in planning and to bring policing activities in line with local concerns. It provides a mechanism by which we can report on progress, or obstacles encountered to the Mayors, Councils, and communities we serve.
- The APP is the "ROAD MAP" for the detachment activities throughout the year running from April 1 to March 31.
- The APP has a quarterly reporting feature that is completed and reviewed by the Detachment and Southern Alberta District Management Teams.
- The APP also has an internal Unit Level Quality
 Assurance (ULQA) component that allows Senior
 Managers to assess internal operations and improve
 service delivery.



- Each year in preparation to develop and build a new APP, the Detachment Management Team (DMT) conducts external/internal inquiries and information sessions.
- Input from these sessions will help us determine what the policing priorities should be for the upcoming year.
- Tonight we are hosting this Community Consultation Session in Coaldale with support from your Mayor & Counsel and Town staff.
- We hope to get feedback from all in attendance to understand what Policing Priorities are important to this community.



2024/2025 Annual Performance Plan Initiatives for Coaldale-Picture Butte RCMP

- 1.Crime Prevention Police visibility, target repeat offenders, intelligence led policing, educate community. e.g.: Crime prevention programs, meeting with local agencies, share intelligence.
- 2. Police Visibility/Community Relations Build and maintain positive relations with all our communities. e.g.: Proactive patrols, presentations and activities.
- 3. Enhance Road Safety Through education & enforcement. e.g.: Joint projects with CPOs, Sheriffs.

- Prolific repeat offenders
- Domestic violence
- Drug abuse

- Intersection violations




What do Police Officers Do?

- Respond to calls for service: 911 calls, telephone calls from the public, neighbouring police agencies, etc.
- Front counter complaints: members of the public who attend detachments to request assistance, report a crime, file a complaint, etc.
- Proactive enforcement: observed activities that require police intervention
- Training




Police Files – Town of Coaldale






Call Volume Per Month






Top Files By Workload






Top Files By Volume

 - Intelligence driven enforcement (Analyst/Partners)
- Street enforceable conditions
 - On bail release
 - Probation orders
- Community engagement



Crime Prevention

Here are some tips for keeping your personal property safe:

- Turn on outside lights at night/have a motion sensor
- Don't leave keys in vehicles
- Park recreational vehicles in locked garages or sheds
 - If you can't park indoors, park recreational vehicles in sight and chained to something
- Install surveillance cameras
- Engrave items with your name or a serial number
- Keep a detailed list of property including photos and serial numbers
- Report any suspicious behavior
- Follow a nightly checklist to ensure everything is locked up
